- Progress and attainment scores for Pupil Premium students have increased in 2018 and are very good indeed. In all progress areas, PP students are either above average or well above average – in English having almost diminished the difference altogether between PP and non-PP students (a gap of -0.2). There is still some way to go in mathematics (a gap of -0.5), but even here, the progress of the PP students is in line with the National Average.
- Attainment follows a similar picture in both English and maths, with English showing very little variance between the PP and non-PP cohort and maths slightly behind.
- Attainment for PP attaining a grade 5 or above in English and maths is below the non-PP cohort. There is a -10% difference at grade 5 or above and a -17% difference at grade 4 and above in both. This demonstrates that our efforts have been successful where progress is the case, but in terms of actual attainment, we still have more work to do.
- The trend however, over time, is ever upward. In the categories above, we made a +10% increase of PP pupils attaining a 5 or above in English and maths compared to 2017 and a +6% increase at level 4 and above.
