



# To coincide (verb)

### **Definition:**

- 1. To occur at the same time.
- 2. To correspond in nature; tally.

Root: early 18th century (in the sense 'occupy the same space'): from medieval Latin coincidere, from co-'together with' + incidere 'fall upon or into'.

### Synonyms:

- Occur simultaneously, happen together.
- 2. Tally, correspond, agree, concur.
